Fundraising Case

Raiz Foundation, Inc., through its partner Fundación Raiz Ecuador, has been an early respondent to the COVID19 pandemic. We support vulnerable communities in Ecuador, a country greatly affected by this health crisis and suffering one of the highest number of COVID19 cases per capita with correspondingly high death tolls particularly in impoverished communities along the coast.

Fundación Raiz Ecuador has focused on communities living in extreme poverty in Atacames, where livelihoods were compromised by the 2016 earthquake, as well as indigenous minorities in Amazonia whose cultures are in danger of disappearing due to premature departure of elders caused by COVID19. We also have focused on impoverished families living in the provinces of Esmeraldas and Sucumbíos, where the COVID19 crisis is exacerbated by proximity to the conflictive drug war areas of Colombia.

Funds provided by Raiz Foundation Inc. permitted Fundación Raiz Ecuador to react quickly as the pandemic unfolded. Ecuador's private sector recognized this early response and has provided funds allowing Fundación Raiz Ecuador to deliver over 230 metric tons of food to assist over 5,000 vulnerable families. Ecuador's government has recognized Fundación Raiz Ecuador for helping the national health system diagnose the first reported cases of COVID19 infections in indigenous peoples.

Now in a second phase of our assistance to vulnerable families in Ecuador, Raiz Foundation Inc. seeks to raise funds in the amount of \$629,000 to supplement \$240,500 that have already been raised through in-kind donations of 4,000 rapid tests, 2,500 PCR tests and a \$100,000 challenge.

The second phase has 3 components:

I) **Food Security for the most vulnerable.** Families that Fundación Raíz Ecuador has identified as most vulnerable to food shortages due to local lockdowns or because they are dependent on economic activities most affected by the COVID crisis (tourism) and because they are ethnic minorities at risk of losing elders that support their cultural heritage.

II) **Medical supplies:** Supplies for protecting medical staff of the Public Health System from COVID19 infection. Oxygen provision is a top priority for hospitalizing indigenous peoples locally rather than at distant hospitals. Many of the supplies and instruments considered here will serve a larger population beyond indigenous groups.

III) **Epidemiological monitoring:** Fundación Raíz Ecuador is supporting an effort between communities and Ecuador's Ministry of Health to foster a strong epidemiological system combining community participation and vigilance with technical/scientific support from professional epidemiologists. Fundación Raíz Ecuador has already secured an important number of PCR and rapid tests for this purpose.

We want to support the use of ELISA based immunological essays for low cost, high-quality immunological response tests in replacement of the existing rapid tests. ELISA tests will be based on technology developed by the University of Michigan that has released patents for use in Ecuador of highly sensitive, selective COVID testing.

Raiz Foundation Inc. aims to raise \$629,000 to support over 21,000 people in peril of losing food security and with minimal access to emergency health needs such as oxygen and basic medicines. These funds will also support epidemiological monitoring of indigenous communities plus a much larger population of over 100,000 people in their area.

The entire proposal calls for \$869,000 dollars of which \$240,500 dollars have been secured in the form of in-kind donations of PRC and rapid tests plus a \$100,000 matching fund.


Work done to date with COVID19 in Ecuador
